Students are encouraged to critically analyze information and to question established theories, seeking to gain a deeper understanding of the world and its complex social and political dynamics. Each of the classes in the Global Humanities Program fulfills the upper division Humanities electives for all students and the upper division Humanities block for all students in the College of Liberal Arts.
